Falcons win in shootout; into finals

After Saturday, he may make an exception. Tied with Piketon 5-5 after the second overtime, the Falcons and the Redstreaks' sectional semifinal was decided in a shootout. Price breathed a little easier afterward, as Minford outscored Piketon 4-2 on penalty kicks to win the match and move onto the sectional championship.

"I have gone through these before when I coached up north," said Price. "In overtime, I felt confident that we were going to score. We pounded it at the goal, but we just couldn't put it in."

The Falcons started the scoring early on Saturday, with Evan Price scoring just 31 seconds into the game. Keenan Havens would add a score at 14:04 to put the team up 2-0, but the Redstreaks' Mark Walters added two goals over the next three minutes to even the score. Trent Phillips and Evan Price would add a goal apiece in the final minutes to put Minford up 4-2 at the half.

Piketon would answer in the second half, with Walters leading the charge. The senior scored all three goals in
