P.T.O. News

The P.T.O. concluded the Human-I-tees fundraiser in late April. There were a total of 36 students who participated from the Primary and Middle Schools. Twenty-four students received certificates for helping to save 100 square feet of rainforest each! The fundraiser has helped protect almost 15,000 square feet of rainforest and raised \$1,428 profit for the Accelerated Reader store and new playgrounds. The AR store costs approximately \$4,000-\$5,000 each year to operate
